Discussion:

- JoAnn shared that Sarah Raskin with the L. Douglas Wilder School of Government and Public affairs at VCU discussed with VDH Dental Health Program that the received research support to contribute to Qualitative Data on the pregnant women's benefit and implementation and the opportunity for Focus groups with pregnant women to discuss what are barriers to access care and hopefully to expand statewide. They are wanting to pilot focus groups in WIC clinics around the Richmond area and that this could be expanded statewide. At the November Early Dental Home Action Team/Perinatal and Infant Oral Health Quality Improvement Expansion Grant Project Advisory Board meeting, it was revealed through the WIC Basic Screening Survey and the WIC participant survey that safety was a concern with pregnant women.
- Dr. Naavaal gave an update what was discussed at the last meeting, including their work with DMAS with data analysis and needing not only a local community person on this subgroup, but someone from the Petersburg area. Additionally, there was discussion have someone from DMAS. Richard Zucker wanted to make sure there would not be a conflict of interest with Aetna, and DMAS. Marcia Coward share that it was carved out that it would not be a conflict. Richard will check to be sure.
- Lauren discussed the Petersburg community assessment that led to house chats with Community Health Worker to go directly into home to discuss oral health, and that this may be an opportunity to leverage that model.
- Richard Zucker was interested in the medical integration with the Fluoride Varnish Program. Tiffany Wright shared information about in-person and online training and incorporating it into the well child clinics. Attached are the Fluoride Varnish Program informational flyers.
